Darcy's dice with death sparks concern for other pets WARNING FOR DOG OWNERS

A very frightening "near miss" recently for Sue Dwyer when her dog "Darcy" became very ill and lapsed into a coma after returning from a walk along the reserve in Moss Vale. Darcy was rushed to the vets who were initially unable to determine what had happened. Vet Ken Davidson said "It appeared that Darcy had suffered a massive stroke. He had no pain reflexes at all and appeared to be brain dead except for his breathing." Also, there were no signs of snake bite or common poisoning.

A lucky recollection of a similar incident involving an African Lion at Warragamba Lion Park in the late 70's, pointed to poisoning by a barbiturate. So how could a barbiturate have been around the area? Mr Davidson said he had heard of it being put into mice for bait to kill feral cats but its extremely rare" all symptoms pointed to the ingestion of the drug.

Sue returned to the reserve and took the same path but was unable to find any explanation or a dead animal that may have caused Darcy's problems

Sue has warned other dog owners in the area "Be very careful when walking your dogs; don't let them out of your sight, especially the young ones"

The story ended on a happy note as Darcy is now on the mend and won't have any lasting effects.
